## Email to reference who expressed interest in becoming a mentor

Sometimes while interviewing references that a mentor applicant provides, the reference might express interest in learning more about the program. Below is a template that can be sent to these individuals, sharing more information on the program and provides next steps on how to apply to be a mentor. Please customize as needed for your outreach strategies.
